

The Friend of the Court can monitor a current child support case and, if a delinquency is owed, file a motion to enforce against the noncustodial parent (obligor). This can be done independently or through an [application for services](#).

Applicants must be current on the annual payment of the \$36.00 child support service fee.

The noncustodial parent (obligor) must be served by a process server or Sheriff's Department. The custodial parent must provide a valid address for the obligor.

If an obligor resides outside of El Paso County, the custodial parent (obligee) must provide a \$175.00 process server fee deposit. This deposit will be collected from the obligor at the time of trial.

Child support includes medical support, therefore, if the noncustodial parent (obligor) is required to provide health insurance and does not, or if the custodial parent has enrolled the children on his/her health insurance and is not receiving reimbursement, this can be made a part of an enforcement action.

Medical support includes [uninsured health expense reimbursement](#). If one party has incurred medical expenses and has notified the other party; but the other party fails or refuses to reimburse the expense, FOC can enforce the reimbursement portion of the medical support order.
