Innovative and traditional techniques towards interdiction and investigation are taught in this course. It will help the student recognize non verbal communication, with specific references to gestures most often prior to assault or escape behaviors, how to use their posture and communication style for maximum results, and how to add techniques to diffuse hostility and violence in the early stages of development to their interpersonal skills. <p style="text-align: center;">E-Training</p> <p>CALEA: (2 hrs) TCLEOSE 3754 El Paso County Sheriff's Office Personnel ONLY! Mandatory for all personnel working within the law enforcement bureaus. CALEA standards require employees working in the law enforcement divisions to attend <i>refresher</i> training on CALEA prior to the re-accreditation, during the self-assessment phase. <p style="text-align: center;">E-Training CIVILIAN TRAINING</p> <p>COMBATING COMMUNICABLE DISEASES: (8 hrs) TCLEOSE 3800 This course will familiarize civilian personnel with occupational exposure and contagious disease control, which is contained in Policy 4.09 of the Sheriff's Policy Manual. This class explains; practices to follow that will protect employees and others against infections caused by contagious diseases, general procedures for affected employees and certain applicants for employment and procedures for submission of Worker's Compensation claims. This course will provide the officer with the history of the Constitution and its amendments in order to provide a better understanding of the rights and privileges inmates possess. The course will go into the differences between a right and a privilege. The course additionally provides the officer with case law and established precedence. This course is designed to train the officer on early warning signs and symptoms an inmate may possess. The training will help the officer to take a proactive approach to identifying and preventing suicidal attempts in a jail setting. The course will make the officer aware of potential liabilities that may occur when suicides are successful in a facility. <p style="text-align: center;">E-Training</p> <p>COMMUNITY AND PROBLEM ORIENTED POLICING: (8 hrs) TCLEOSE 3914 This course takes the student through the history of policing and brings them to the present with community and problem oriented policing. The second part of the course will take the student to community oriented policing with a focus on the Kansas City experiment, the design and the outcome. The third part of the course is S.A.R.A model of decision making and the final aspect is a test of the student's ability to critically analyze a problem and develop a course of action. <p style="text-align: center;">E-Training</p> <p>INTERMEDIATE USE OF FORCE IN A JAIL SETTING: (16 Hrs) TCLEOSE 3504 This course is a TCLEOSE requirement for Intermediate JAILER Certification. Upon completion of this course, the student will have a thorough understanding of the use of force guidelines when using force on an inmate and to follow established protocol with the policy and procedures. The officer will have a thorough understanding of the defenses to prosecution as depicted in Chapter 9 of the Penal Code. The officer will have a basic understanding of the causes of disruptive behavior and disturbances. The officer will be able to take preventative actions to protect against potential civil liability. <p style="text-align: center;">E-Training CIVILIAN TRAINING</p> <p>FIRE AND SAFETY: (2 hrs) TCLEOSE 3512 This class is intended for all civilian personnel to become familiar with basic fire fighting techniques in case of a fire emergency at or near their work station. The student will become familiar with the components of a fire, and learn the different types of fire extinguishers that are in use for specific types of fires. The student will learn the prescribed uses and the locations of fire extinguishers in or near their work areas to respond quickly to a fire. A basic understanding of emergency equipment use is crucial for your safety and the safety of other workers in your work stations. Physical Fitness Requirements

** Some courses offered by the El Paso County Sheriff's Office Region VIII Training Academy will require a degree of physical fitness.

- **Minimum Level-** This level will consist of walking, stepping, and very light cardiovascular exercise.
- **Medium Level-** This level will consist of Jogging, minimal levels of calisthenics i.e. push-ups, sit-ups, side straddle hop, beginning levels of hands on classes i.e. PPCT and O.C.
- **Maximum Level-** This level will consist of running, sprinting, advanced calisthenics, advanced levels of hands on classes i.e. mobile field force, physical fitness exams.
- **Medium and maximum-** levels will require a blood pressure screening and students who do not pass will not be allowed to participate without a doctor's release on file.
